Komala of Revolutionary Toilers of Iranian Kurdistan (Şorrişgêrrî zehmetkêşan)	Founded in 1969 in Tehran. The party has since experienced multiple splits with the different factions primarily operating from the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. This faction is currently led by Abdullah Mohtadi. Kurdistan Free Life Party (PJAK)	Founded in 2004 when the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) changed its strategy from one centralized party to regional organizations that could adapt to local conditions. PJAK shares the ideology of PKK founder and leader Abdullah Ocalan, but was not impacted by the PKK's May 2025 dissolution and decision to disarm.
